#### **▶** Association Description:

The Association of British Investigators (ABI) is the longest established organisation representing professional Investigators in the UK with its foundations laid way back in 1913. With the absence of any statutory control of the investigation industry in the UK, the ABI recognised the need for self-regulation many years ago and set very high standards to meet the criteria for membership opting for quality rather than quantity. Members are admitted only after stringent vetting. Members must conduct their business in a professional manner, with Professional Indemnity Insurance and by complying with a strict code of ethics & professional standards, with disciplinary procedures in place to monitor any transgressors. Members are also requested to provide a Criminal Convictions Certificate no older than 3 years. A Governing Council normally consisting of a minimum of 7 and up to 10 Full members (of more than 2-years) including the President and the Chairman of the Board, oversees the administration of The Association, which is conducted day to day by the Secretariat team from the offices in Elstree. The Governing Council officers are democratically elected by the membership each year at an annual conference. The Association is recognized and supported by The Law Society of England & Wales, The Association is also the only sector accredited association with The Law Society of Scotland and the government body, The Drivers and Vehicle Licensing Agency.

#### >Association Activities:

The ABI is currently working on its own UK GDPR Code of Conduct which it is anticipated has been submitted to the data protection supervisory authority (the ICO) for approval.

There has since the introduction of the GDPR in 2018, a new world order developing in data protection. Whilst the GDPR is a direct regulation on the EU member states, many outside nations are adopting similar local legislation including the UK, not just for good governance, but as a pre-requisite to trade agreements within and outside Europe.

The ABI UK GDPR Code of Conduct, if approved, may form the template for other national sector representative bodies to use to pursue similar Code Ownership status in their respective countries.

The ABI's Code project is not fully supported by other trade bodies who continue to campaign for statutory regulation.

The ABI did invite both other trade bodies to work with the ABI but this did not gain positive responses. The ABI has however opened its activities for non member participation by sharing most of its industry articles on LinkedIn and changing its next annual conference to all professional investigators.

The ABI continues to move towards adopting the term "Professional Investigations".
